All breeds recognized by an accredited breed association will be eligible to show.

All animals whether registered or non-registered, as well as PEE WEE class must have a scrapies tag and health papers, before they can enter the fair grounds. A veterinarian will inspect animals before entering fair grounds.

All non-registered, crossbred animals show in the Junior show only.

Open show entries must be registered in their respective association.

Exhibitor is limited to 2 breeds & 2 entries per class.

Group classes are limited to 1 group per exhibitor

Market goats must weigh 55 lbs. at fair weigh-in. If Market goat does not meet weight the 55 lb., requirement they will not be able to sell their animal at the fair auction, but they will be able to show their animal in the market class.

Age divisions for showmanship: Juniors 8-11 yrs.; Intermediate 12-16 yrs.;

Seniors – 17-21 yrs.

Pee Wee Class – Youth ages 4-7 years old. This class is open to any youngster to either show a sheep or goat. Exhibition ONLY for the fun and experience.
