## CANNED & PRESERVED GOODS

Heather Allen in Charge

1. All canned goods must be in standard, clear glass pint or quart jars, sealed with two-piece lids, clear of rust and processed within the time between the previous fair and entry date for this year's fair. Must be processed per current USDA, Ball or Kerr Guidelines
2. Other Preservation Methods must be displayed in standard clear glass jars, pint or quart, with 2 piece lids. These are not required to be processed. This includes Dehydrated Fruits, Vegetable, Meats (including Jerky)
3. Vinegars may be displayed in clear decorative glass bottles capped firmly with caps/corks.

Premiums: Classes 1: \$8, \$6, \$4; Best of Show \$10.00 All other classes: \$4.00, \$3.00, \$2.00

# AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS (Continued)

## Bee Keeping

1. Entries must be the product of the entrant's apiary, and must have been produced within the 12 months immediately prior to the current fair.
2. Entrants are limited to one entry per class.
3. Due to honey's self-preserving nature, and that boiling honey destroys its natural properties, these classes do not have to be sealed.

### Class

1. EXTRACTED HONEY
  - a. Light Honey - 1 to 4 years in project
  - b. Light Honey - 5 or more years in project
  - c. Amber Honey - 1 to 4 years in project
  - d. Amber Honey - 5 or more years in project
  - e. Dark Honey - 1 to 4 years in project
  - f. Dark Honey - 5 or more years in project
2. CREAMED HONEY (Finely granulated) Submit 3, 1 1/2 pound standard canning jars, using standard canning lids (unsealed) for each entry.
  - a. Dark Honey
  - b. Light Honey
3. CHUNK HONEY - Submit 3, 1-qt. standard canning jars, using standard canning lids (unsealed) for each entry
  - a. Any cut comb placed in a jar surrounded with liquid honey.

### Class

4. COMB HONEY
  - a. Frame - 1 square or round section wrapped in a clear plastic
  - b. Cut Comb - 3 standard sections wrapped in clear plastic wrap.
  - c. Standard Section - 3 sections wrapped in clear plastic wrap or window cartons
5. BEESWAX
  - a. Pure beeswax - 1 lb. or more, single block, unwrapped
  - b. Molded or art design wax
  - c. Dipped beeswax candles - 2 candles per entry
  - d. Molded beeswax candles - 2 candles per entry
  - e. Beeswax novelty or set
