1. All entries must be completed by noon Tuesday including complete address.
2. All items exhibited must be shown as to allow easy access for judging and viewing or no premium money will be allocated to those specific entries.
3. Articles exhibited must have been constructed by FFA member, either as part of their mechanics instruction in vocational agriculture and no more than six of these items shall be exhibited by one school.
4. Entries will be judged on the basis of workmanship, design and appearance.
5. There are no regulations on construction dates; however, the articles must be in a clean and presentable condition even though they may have been used and they must not have been exhibited at this Fair before.
6. Each exhibitor is limited to two entries in each class.
7. Exhibits will be released at at 9:00 a.m. on Sunday. The fair board is not responsible for items left after 4:00 p.m. on Sunday.
8. All items exhibited must be "constructed"; reconditioned items will be accepted and judged on the basis of technique of re-ovation procedure.
9. Items for exhibit which may be added to an item shown last year, such as a wagon bed for exhibit placed on a wagon shown the previous year, must be clearly indicated on the entry form by the instructor. Failure to do so will cause disqualification of all items exhibited from that school.
10. A school shall not exhibit more than six items in a class which are listed in the catalog with a gold premium of 8 points or less, or if the gold premium decided by the judge is 8 points or less, not more than six of these items shall be exhibited.
11. Items which are removed before the indicated time or not properly released will result in the loss of premium for the items.
12. The Fair Committee reserves the right to refuse any exhibit they deem inappropriate for exhibition.
13. The judge, together with the Chairman, shall have the power to set points on any exhibit not listed in the catalog, and adjust points up or down 50% on any item due to unusual amount of work required, either over or under the usual construction normally followed.
14. It shall be the responsibility of exhibitors and their instructors to see that all items are properly identified.
15. A Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Project Plaques or Awards will be awarded.
