All breeds recognized by an accredited breed association will be eligible to show. All animals whether registered or non-registered, as well as PEE WEE class must have a scrapies tag and health papers, before they can enter the fairgrounds. A veterinarian will inspect animals before entering fairgrounds. All non-registered, crossbred animals show in the Junior show only. Open show entries must be registered in their respective association. Exhibitors are limited to 2 breeds & 2 entries per class.

Group classes are limited to 1 group per exhibitor

Market goats must weigh 55 lbs. at fair weigh-in. If a Market goat does not meet the 55 lb., requirement they will not be able to sell their animal at the fair auction, but they will be able to show their animal in the market class.

Age divisions: Novice – 7 & Under; Junior – 8 – 11; Intermediate – 12 – 16; Senior – 17 – 21 (4-H/FFA) All showmanship classes will be held on Friday, July 28<sup>th</sup>, after the breed show. Pee Wee Class – Youth ages 5-7 years old.

This class is open to any youngster to either show a sheep or goat. Exhibition ONLY for the fun and experience. Will Show Friday, July 28<sup>th</sup>, 2023 at 9:00 a.m.

exhibits throughout the fair: 1) Good public relations with the fair-going community. 2) The care of their animals and presentation and 3) Exhibiting and Showmanship on show day. The judging is made up of a committee. Recipient will be named at the awards presentation before the sale on Saturday.

Exhibitors are encouraged to decorate or make the pen area appealing to the fair-going public. Recognition of your Farm/4-H Club/FFA organizations are encouraged.

### **Entries:**

a. All entries will be submitted by going to http://gasconadecounty.fairentry.com/; by logging in through your 4HOnline family profile or creating a Fair Entry profile if FFA or breeder. Registrations for livestock classes will run from May 15-July 1. Please register early! Contact the Extension Office at 573-437-2165 if you need assistance. NO LATE REGISTRATIONS FOR LIVESTOCK WILL BE ACCEPTED.

b. All entry fees, selling fees will be paid by credit/debit card online or check/M.O. mailed to the Gasconade County Fair Assn, P O Box 15, Owensville, MO 65066 by July 8, 2023.

c. Livestock Exhibitors must purchase their Season Passes at a participating local business.

d. To be eligible to show and sell a Market Goat (Class 1A), the exhibitor must live in Gasconade County or be a member of a 4-H Community Club or FFA Chapter within Gasconade County.
