

Farm Pull Rules and Regulations 2024

Date: Saturday, July 27, 2024 Registration: 7:00-8:00 P.M. Pull Starts: Approx 9:00 P.M. (After MO Farm Pullers)

1. Contest will be limited to field class tractors only. NO tire chains, rear duals or four-wheel drives allowed. NO hand-cut or hand sharpened tires allowed.
2. **Entry fee is \$40.00 per tractor (fee includes up to 2 classes).**
3. **All tractors may enter 2 classes only.** The 2 classes must be the same weight class.
4. Classes:

- a. 0-8,000 lb. – 6 mph – tire size: 16.9-38
 - b. 8,001-10,000 lb. – 6 mph – tire size: 18.4-38
 - c. 10,001-12,000 lb. – 6 mph – tire size: 20.8-38
 - d. 0-8,000 lb. – no speed limit – tire size: 16.9-38
 - e. 8,001-10,000 lb. – no speed limit – tire size: 18.4-38
 - f. 10,001-12,000 lb. – no speed limit – tire size: 20.8-38

*Weight of tractor includes driver.
**Tires must be proper size or the equivalent.
Formula to determine equivalent: (width x 2) + diameter
5. **Drawbar height limit will be 20 inches.** Minimum length of drawbar will be 20 inches from center of rear axle.
6. All tractors must have a **hitch with a 3-inch opening** allowing hook to swing free.
7. **All tractors MUST HAVE a working PTO.**
8. **Max 3,000 RPM limit. At judges discretion, the RPM limit may be checked by the PTO after pull.**
9. Rear tractor weights cannot interfere with hooking of sled. Three pt. weights must be turned so the heaviest side is to the inside of the tractor and not sled.
10. Fuel: One fuel only – Gas, LP or Diesel.
11. Removal of items such as hoods and other items which create a safety hazard will not be allowed. All tractors must use two front wheels.
12. All weights must be bolted or securely fasted to the tractor. Any loss of weights will result in disqualification. Any front-end weight cannot extend more than 24 inches in front of the factory hood on the tractor.
13. **Contestants Under 18 years of age must have written consent of parent or guardian. Parent and participant must sign provided form day of event.**
14. The maximum speed will be recorded by the pulling sled. If the maximum speed exceeded during the pull, a horn will sound from the sled. Each puller has from the start of the pull to the 100 ft. mark to set their speed. If the puller exceeds the maximum speed past the 100-ft. mark, the puller is disqualified.
15. No person will be allowed in the area other than tractor operators and contest officials.
16. The pull is ended when:
 - a. Forward motion of tractor stops.
 - b. Driver does not remain seated.
 - c. Tractor or sled does not stay within the pulling strip or tractor hitch breaks.
 - d. If track official waves red flag, participant will stop.
17. **If a puller is not ready when his turn comes, he will forfeit the pull in that class.**
18. Unsportsmanship conduct before, during or after tractor pull will mean disqualification, also forfeiture of entry fee plus prize money won.
19. First puller of each class has the option of repulling. If repulling, contestant must tell judges before unhooking from the sled. Last pull is measured. If sled is not readjusted before the fourth tractor pulls in each class, class will be official.
20. **Tractors will be weighed immediately before pulling.**
21. Caution should be exercised at all times. Failure to comply with safety procedures may result in disqualification.
22. All disabled tractors must be removed from the track prior to the next tractor pulling. The committee will use whatever means deemed necessary to remove the tractor.
23. Protests can only be made by a contestant in the same weight class. All protests must be made before the next class starts or 5 minutes after the last tractor in the last class is finished. Pull is official unless the tractor is checked and found to be out of compliance. The driver that makes the protest will be checked for the same infraction.
24. Tractor driver and one other person will not have to pay entry onto fairgrounds as long as they accompany the tractor.
25. The Tractor Pulling Committee will have final decision on all questions, disputes, hardship cases, etc. that may develop.
