All breeds recognized by a breed association will be eligible to show; as well as unregistered crossbred animals (Jr. Show only). Open Show entries must be registered in their respective association and papers provided upon request. All animals <u>must have</u> an official USDA scrapies tag and current health papers. A veterinarian will inspect animals as they enter/arrive at the fair. Exhibitors will be allowed to show 2 breeds of sheep and 2 per class (group classes limited to 1 group). Only blue and red ribbon animals will be eligible to show in the Open Show.

Age divisions: Novice -7 & Under; Junior -8-11; Intermediate -12-16; Senior -17-21 (4-H/FFA)

Pee Wee Class - Youth ages 5-7 years old.

This class is open to any youngster to either show a sheep or goat. Exhibition ONLY for the fun and experience.

Will Show Friday, July 26th, 2024, at 9:00 a.m.

Exhibitors must provide their own bedding for the Sheep and Goat Barn as well as removal of bedding. All animals are required to stay in the Sheep and Goat barn prior to the shows.

<u>Lee Freeman Memorial Herdsman Award</u> is awarded to one exhibitor in the Sheep and Goat Barn who exhibits.throughout the fair: 1) Good public relations with the fair-going community. 2) The care of their animals and presentation and 3) Exhibiting and Showmanship on show day. The judging is made up of a committee. Recipient will be named at the awards presentation before the sale on Saturday.

Exhibitors are encouraged to decorate or make the pen area appealing to the fair—going public. Recognition of your farm/4-H Club/ FFA organizations are encouraged.

- c. Livestock Exhibitors must purchase their Season Passes at a participating local business.
- d. To be eligible to show and sell a Market Lamb, the exhibitor must live in Gasconade County or be a member of a 4-H Community Club or FFA Chapter within Gasconade County.
