All breeds recognized by a breed association will be eligible to show as well as unregistered crossbred animals. Open show entries must be registered in their respective breed association and papers provided upon request. All animals must have an official USDA scrapies tag and current health papers. A veterinarian will inspect animals as they enter/arrive at the fair. The exhibitor needs to be available with health papers for inspection. Exhibitors will be allowed to show 2 breeds of animals and 2 per class (group classes are limited to 1 group)

Showmanship Class Age divisions:

Novice 5-7; Junior 8-11; Intermediate 12-16; Senior 17-21 (4-H/FFA) Jr. Show is 4-H/FFA members 8-21yrs old - Breed/Open Show- 5yrs-Adults

Showmanship will be awarded during the market show on Thursday evening, as well as on Friday, for the Junior and Open Show PEE WEE Class-Youth Ages 4-7 yrs. old. PEE WEE youth are not eligible to show in any other classes. This class is open to any youth showing a sheep or goat, exhibition ONLY for the fun and experience.

The PEE WEE class will be on Friday morning @ 9 am before the breed show.

Please enter the PEE WEE class in the Fair Entry system as well.

Exhibitors must provide their own bedding in the Sheep and Goat Barn, as well as removal at the end of the fair.

All animals are required to stay in the barn unless an adult buck may need to be trailered at night for the safety of all visiting does. Breed show animals must be owned 30 days before the fair.

Exhibitors are encouraged to decorate or make their pens appealing to the fair-going public.

Recognition of your farm/4-H/FFA organizations is encouraged.

LEE FREEMAN Memorial Herdsman Award-Lee Freeman was a local AG teacher, his family showed for many years at the Gasconade County Fair. He dedicated his time at the fair to teaching the youth how to present, exhibit and care for their livestock as well as enthusiasm, responsibility, and presentation. - All entries will be submitted by going to <http://gasconadecounty.fairentry.com/> by logging in through your 4HOnline family profile or creating a Fair Entry profile if FFA or breeder. Registration for livestock classes will run May 15-Jul 1. Please register early! Contact the Extension Office at 573-266-2701 if you need assistance. NO LATE REGISTRATIONS FOR LIVESTOCK WILL BE ACCEPTED.
- All entry fees, and selling fees, will be paid by credit/debit card online or check/M.O. mailed to the Gasconade County Fair Assn., P.O. Box 15, Owensville, MO 65066 by July 7, of the current year.
- Livestock Exhibitors must purchase their Season Pass at a participating local business.
- To be eligible to show and sell a market animal, the exhibitor must live in Gasconade County or be a member of a 4-H Community Club or FFA Chapter within Gasconade County.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR GASCONADE COUNTY 4-H AND FFA MARKET LAMB AND GOAT SHOW AND SALE Market Show Thursday @ 7:00 p.m.

All in-county 4-H/FFA members must weigh their sheep and goats on the 1st Saturday of May (of the current year) to be eligible for the Youth Livestock Sale at the fair and to be considered for the Grand and Reserve Champion and Rate of Gain awards. Failure to weigh in during the specified time will result in ineligibility for these opportunities. The maximum weight at weigh-in for lambs is 50 lbs. When entering on FairEntry.com, the in-county exhibitors will enter class number 1a. Out-of-county exhibitors or in-county exhibitors who choose not to weigh in will enter class number 1b. (Animals in class 1b are not eligible to sell in the sale or be recognized as Grand or Reserve Market animals, as this is a county award.)

1. Scrapies Tag must be attached to animal's ear as well as the county tag put in at weigh-in. (if your animal loses their tag, a committee member must be contacted immediately to re-tag.)
2. 4-H/FFA members may weigh-in 3 animals but only bring and show 2 at the fair.
3. Animals to be eligible for the sale, must be weighed in. Otherwise, they will show in the Open Market Class.
4. Animals weights will be recorded and kept by the committee and Extension office as the official beginning weight. The percentage of Rate of Gain will be calculated on Thursday of the

fair after weigh-in at 10:00 a.m., and the best rate of gain will be awarded the Rate of Gain as well as sell in the 3rd slot after Grand and Reserve.

5. A market lamb or goat may be a female or wether. However, grand and reserve must sell at the sale.

6. WEIGHT AT FAIR TIME: 100 lbs. minimum for lamb and 55 lbs. for goats. Lamb teeth must be intact. If a lamb or goat does not reach a weight at the time of weigh-in, they can show in the market class but is not eligible to sell at the sale. The maximum weight for which a premium will be paid out is 150 lbs.

7. Animals going to the Mo. State Fair will need to be identified at the weigh-in and hair pulled by the 4-H Youth Specialists.

8. To be eligible to sell a lamb or goat, the exhibitor must live in Gasconade County, or be a member of a community club or FFA organization in Gasconade County. And they must be a Member in Good Standing with their organization or club. Lambs and Goats must be owned and carried as a 4-H or FFA project by the exhibitor and owned 60 days before the fair or at weigh-in, whichever comes first.

9. There is a \$25.00 per head selling fee.

10. Class placing will set the sale order and if an exhibitor shows 2 animals, the highest placing animal will sell.

11. The Sheep and Goat sale will follow the Barrow sale on Saturday. Order will be Grand, Reserve, Rate of Gain and then class placings.

12. Market Weight Classes will be determined by the number of entries and broke into Light, Medium and Heavy Weight, with the class winners coming back to compete for Grand and Reserve Market animal.

13. There will be a Market Class Showmanship for each youth age division, Junior, Intermediate, and Senior. Showmanship follows the show on Thursday evening.

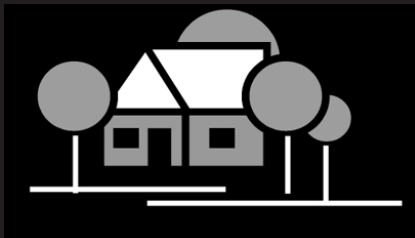

Registrations for livestock classes will run from May 15 - July 1. Please register early! Contact the Extension Office at 573-266-2701 if you need assistance. NO LATE REGISTRATIONS FOR LIVESTOCK WILL BE ACCEPTED.
